Dalrymple Road Community Planting

You are invited to join with staff and volunteers from the Community Environment Fund and Townsville City Council's Greening Townsville Program to celebrate National Tree Day with the planting of more than 1,000 trees at a community planting event on Dalrymple Road.

The event will mark the start of on-ground works on this Community Environment Fund and Greening Townsville project site. Local native trees, shrubs and ground covers will be planted to help reduce the visual impact of the transmission line and contribute to the expansion of native urban habitat.

Everyone, of all ages, is welcome to participate in this community planting. All site preparation (including holes digging) will be done by Townsville City Council's Greening Team prior to the event. Activities on the day will include tree planting, fertilizing, mulching and watering.

Community Environment Fund
