You are invited to participate in a community tree planting with the Woodstock Horse Sport Club, Townsville City Council and Powerlink Queensland.

The community tree planting is part of a project by the Woodstock Horse Sport Club to rehabilitate the banks of the creek running through the Townsville City Council Sport and Recreation Reserve. The area is predominately vegetated with Chinee Apple and provides habitat for many native finches, potentially including the endangered Black-Throated Finch. Local native riparian vegetation will be established while the Chinee Apple will be slowly eradicated to ensure that the bird habitat is maintained.

All site preparation (including hole digging) will be done by Council's Greening team prior to the event. Activities on the day will include tree planting, fertilising, mulching and watering. A BBQ will follow the tree planting activities.

Community Environment Fund
