Community Planting in Your Neighbourhood



Townsville City Council is hosting a community tree planting in your local area as part of an ongoing Envirofund project managed jointly by the local community, Endeavour Gardens and Townsville City Council. This is to follow on from three highly successful community plantings held in this area in 2005 and earlier this year.

- » **When:** Sunday 26th November, 2006
- » **Where:** Meet at Douglas Park located on Keesing Street, Douglas
- » **Time:** 8.00a.m. – 11.00a.m.
- » **What to bring:** Hat, gloves, sturdy and enclosed footwear, sunscreen, drinking water
- » **Free BBQ and drinks after planting and take a free local native plant to plant at home.**
- » The planting will be a combination of local native trees and shrubs as part of an Envirofund project aimed at restoring habitat values, improving water quality, reducing noxious weeds and decreasing stream sediment loads. The project is focussed on Endeavour Creek around the Endeavour Gardens complex and the Ross River between the junction of Endeavour Creek and towards the Charles Barton Bridge. This project forms part of Townsville City Council's Greening Townsville program, which is working to achieve a Townsville that is Clean and Green. Everyone is welcome to participate in our Community Greening events. All site preparation (including hole digging) will be done by Council's Greening and Waterway team prior to the event. Activities on the day will include tree planting, fertilising, mulching and watering. Ongoing site maintenance and watering will be a council responsibility.
